

Supporting the Enabling Environment for better WASH services in Northern Bangladesh

Context

- 1. Widespread existing sanitation coverage, but of a poor standard with many unhygienic latrines and poor faecal sludge management, resulting in unhealthy communities.
- 2. Strong existing micro-finance network and culture which can be leveraged to create a sanitation loan program working with existing local Community Based Organisations (CBOs).


Highlights of the approach

- 1. Partnership approach with CBOs for sanitation loans allowing families to upgrade from basic to improved latrines.
- 2. Working with school hygiene groups to train students and communities on hygiene, including Menstrual Hygiene Management and constructing accessible school sanitation facilities.
- 3. Capacity building for Change Agents, with local CBOs, Community WASH Committees (CWC) and sanitation suppliers, increasing their capacity to plan and deliver effective WASH programs.
