




# Water, Sanitation and Hygiene Output-Based Aid (WASHOBA)

Main project objective: demonstrate to the government cost-effective approaches to deliver sanitation services, especially to the rural poor.







#### Key messages

- 1. Means of water-borne and fecal related spread of disease... and how to prevent it
- 2. Impact of not having proper sanitation and clean water on health, community and the household's finances
- 3. Hygiene promotion
- 4. Introduction of low cost latrine

# Any particular challenges facing the project in this location?



Severe drought in 2016 affected poor families economic situation

No other unique challenges in this area but typical program challenges include:

- Migration to find work outside of the village -> lack of awareness about the program
- Lack of labor for construction
- Less participation of men in village meetings - 80% of participants are women which effects HH decision making on latrine construction as women need to discuss with their husbands.
