Water For Development Strategy Framework



- Water Resource Management
 - Strategy for Australia's aid investments in agriculture, fisheries and water:
- Increasing access to clean <u>water</u>, <u>sanitation</u> and <u>hygiene</u> (WASH)
 - Health for Development Strategy
- Large scale <u>water and sanitation</u> <u>infrastructure</u>
 - Strategy for Australia's investments in Economic Infrastructure

Water For Development Important to Australian Aid

- Global Burden Of Disease: 842,000 deaths in LMIC due to inadequate WASH
 - 58% of total diarrhoeal disease and 1.5% of total burden of disease
- Water Security driving competition for a critical resource
- Water and Sanitation Services are foundations for economic growth in urban, peri urban and small towns
- Services delivery is seen as a government role and lack of access undermines legitimacy



CSWASH Fund - Health Links

- Investment in WASH is a pre-condition for a healthy community
- WASH Human Development link is strong
- WASH reduces rates of undernutrition and stunting
- Lack of investment in WASH has a real economic cost
- WASH is an enabler education and health facilities
- Greatest impact of lack of access falls on women and girls
- Menstrual Hygiene Management is a key issue for gender equality
- CSOs are effective implementation partners in WASH



































Water and Sanitation –SDG6

- Sustainable Development Goal 6 Ensure availability and sustainable management of Water and Sanitation for all
 - 6.1 By 2030 Universal access to safe and affordable drinking water
 - 6.2 By 2030 Access to adequate sanitation and hygiene, ending open defecation paying attention to needs of women and girls
 - 6.3 By 2030 Improve water quality reduce untreated wastewater and improve faecal sludge management
 - 6.4 By 2030 Increase water use efficiency and address water scarcity
 - 6.5 By 2030 Implement water resource management
 - 6.6 By 2020 Protect and restore water related ecosystems
 - 6.a Expand international cooperation and capacity building

Inclusion

Ensure women and girls, people with disabilities and poor people are at the centre of decision making.

RESILIENCE

Water Security

Invest in water projects and planning that strengthen water security and resilient economies

Water Resources Management

Support activities that advance understanding and integration of enhanced water allocation, transboundary cooperation and better valuing of water

Climate Change

Promote program designs and implementation that consider water as a key to adaptation.

EVIDENCE

Monitoring & Data

Support global monitoring to improve sector data

Research

Contribute to building the evidence base for water, sanitation and hygiene

- 21 September 2016 PM Turnbull announced
 \$100 million over 5 years for Water for Women
- Aims to build on CS WASH, increasing focus on women, girls and people with disabilities.
- Continues work of CS WASH Fund working with CSOs on innovative ways to improve access.
- Geographic South Asia, East Asia and the Pacific.
