Context of Western Province, PNG

- Villages have been missed out on vital government services such as education, agriculture, WaSH infrastructure and basic health services.
- 0% access improved toilets
- 4% access improved water
- Their life is spent paddling many kilometres to seek medical assistance and education for their family and children.
- Up to 2 week canoe ride to Daru





CIVIL SOCIETY WATER, SANITATION AND HYGIENE FUND



Context of Western Province, PNG

- There are no roads, transport is by boat.
- Only form of transport is by boat. Can cost up to \$1,500 AUD round trip to middle fly.
- Time taken 6 15 hours one way
- Constant challenges with rough seas and low seas







Context of Western Province (WP), PNG

- 12 metres of rain per year
- Mining and forestry operations has increased sediment flowing into rivers, rising river levels by as much as 10 metres in the last 20 years.
- 75% of Western Province is flat, so during monthly high tides, villages are flooded and are constantly water logged.
- Which is real challenge for walking around the village, particularly for people with mobility issues.
- Toilets have to be above ground







What are the specific challenges/problems that we are trying to address

- People with disabilities in communities are not consulted with
- WASH infrastructure is not accessible to people with disabilities
- In WP there are no Disability Peoples Organisation but a small self-help group:
 - Whose role it is to advocate for people with disabilities
 - Important to support establishment of a DPO so can carry on disability advocacy role
- The National PNG Assembly of Disabled Peoples (PNG ADP);
 - lack resources to travel to Western Province to support establishment of a DPO; and
 - Raise awareness on disability with communities and government;
 - ADP lack tools on how to engage communities and measure disability.

PARTNERING WITH DISABILITY FOCUSSED ORGANISATIONS

- In Australia with CBM (Disability specialists in developing countries)
 - Provide technical support on disability inclusion to WV and National DPO throughout project cycle
 - Travel to PNG, up to twice a year to deliver training, monitor and advocate
 - Support reporting and develop case studies







PARTNERING WITH DISABILITY FOCUSSED ORGANISATIONS

- In PNG with Assembly of Disabled Persons (PNG ADP)
 - leading Disability advocacy group in PNG
 - supporting disability inclusion at project level through
 - out project cycle inception, training, baseline, MTR
 - advising CBM and WV on PNG context.
 - An MOU signed between WV PNG and ADP, covering ADP's role in CS-WASH project.

FIELD VISITS BY DPO

Who speaks to communities

 about disability, sets an example of
 of what people with disabilities can do.

Builds confidence of people with disabilities.





DISABILITY FOCUS IN PROJECT DESIGN AND ACTIVITIES AND BUDGET

- Disaggregated data on disability collected
- People with disabilities involved in committees
- Any infrastructure built in schools/aid posts has accessibility
- Budget lines allocated to disability technical support, research, learning etc.
 - In baseline and follow up surveys, using the Washington Group of Questions to measure disability

BUILDING TOILETS WITH ACCESSIBILITY

 Has raised awareness on disability and importance to consider disability








Approaches we have adopted

HEALTHY ISLANDS CONCEPT

- A community based approach
- Endorsed and eagerly supported by the National Government of PNG
- The HIC has a strong focus on community participation and ownership
- Based on the Ottawa Charter on Health Promotion enabling people to increase control over, and to improve, their health and reach a state of complete physical, mental and social well-being, as a an individual or community.
- Communities have fully engaged with this approach and have taken their communities health and well-being into their own hands and run with it.





How well are these approaches working?

PARTNERSHIP WITH CBM AND PNG ADP

- Involvement of ADP in key project activities helped to raise awareness of disability and challenge community attitudes
- From our focus group discussions with people with disabilities and without disabilities, there is increased awareness and understanding of challenges faced by people with disabilities and their cares.
- ADP are being consulted in other WV other WASH and non-WASH projects
- Given confidence to people with disabilities in communities to speak up in their communities
- Challenge with limited administrative capacity of ADP to be responsive to reporting, invoices etc expectations of WVPNG
- ADP are mentoring and supporting community based people with disabilities
- Developed partnership with Callen services who provide assistive devices and operate a smalls school in Daru for children with disabilities.





How well are the approaches working?

BUILDING THE ACCESSIBLE INFRASTRUCTURE

- Started conversations
- Demonstrated to builders and community how accessible toilets can be built

HEALTHY ISLANDS CONCEPT

- Attitude changes, people are using a disability lens in how to involve people with disabilities
- Some people with disabilities attending community meetings and events and voicing their opinion.

CHALLENGES TO WORKING IN WESTERN PROVINCE

- Which has impacted on our focus on disability
- Sea travel is a very high risk activity
- Procurement of materials from Port Moresby to Daru is
- a nightmare
